January Outing - Albert Village Lake & Albion LS

Saturday 19th January 2019

Albert Village Lake has been created on land reclaimed after coal extraction, it is fast becoming a birding hotspot, with an impressive list of species recorded. Whilst still operational, the nearby Albion Landfill Site is providing excellent habitat for many species of Gulls. Meeting at the Albert Village car park at 0930, our focus will be on the wintering wildfowl and large numbers of Gulls found at the lake and landfill site. The main aim of this outing is to provide help in identifying the more common species of birds and a chance to meet the regulars of the LROS outings.

Directions:

From Leicester take the A50/A511 to Ashby-de-la-zouch, after the main A42 island continue to the next island, take the first exit left and follow this road through the town down the hill to a mini island, go straight on towards Shellbrook, on arriving at a main crossroads in Moira turn right onto Rawdon Road, follow this road to Albert Village taking the first left onto Occupation Road, the car park is located just down the road on the right.
