## June Outing - Bempton Cliffs & Blacktoft Sands

**Saturday 16th June 2018**

Easily the best place in England to see, hear and smell seabirds! More than 200,000 birds make the cliffs seem alive – with adults bringing food to their nests, or young chicks making their first faltering flights. Gannets, Guillemots, Razorbills, Kittiwakes, Fulmars and the delightful Puffins all easily seen from the clifftop viewpoints, meeting at the reserve car park at 1000. Later in the day we will visit Blacktoft Sands with its tidal reedbed, the largest in England, being important for its breeding Bearded Tits, Bitterns and Marsh Harriers.

**Directions:**

The reserve is on the cliff road from the village of Bempton, which is on the B1229 road from Flamborough to Filey. In Bempton village, turn northwards at the White Horse public house and the reserve is at the end of the road after 1 mile (follow the brown tourist signs).
